

LARGE STORES AND FOOD CHAINS TRADE INDEX. DECEMBER 2021


Sales in large stores and food chains in the Basque Country closed 2021 with annual growth of 0.2%

Sales of food products in 2021 were down 3.4% whereas sales of other products were up 8.6%

In the cumulative total for 2021, sales in large stores and food chains in the Basque Country increased by 0.2% compared to 2020 and at constant prices, according to Eustat data. Sales of food products saw a downturn of 3.4% whereas sales of other products were up 8.6%.

By province, in Bizkaia and Álava sales at constant prices in 2021 as a whole in this type of establishments rose by 1.9% and 1.0%, respectively. In contrast, in Gipuzkoa sales had a negative evolution, with a 2.9% drop in cumulative sales in 2021 compared to 2020.

The number of individuals employed in large stores and food chains in the Basque Country rose by 3.9% in 2021 in relation to 2020.

Analysing data exclusively from **December 2021** sales in large stores and food chains in the Basque Country registered a year-on-year downturn at constant prices of 3.7%, in homogenous terms of the working calendar. Compared to November, sales were down 1.6%, in deseasonalised terms.

This year-on-year decrease in sales in large stores and food chains in December 2021 was registered in both food products (-3.7%) and other products (-3.5%).

By province, the drop in sales in year-on-year terms (December 2021 compared to December 2020) was generalised. In Álava, the decrease stood at 2.0%, in Bizkaia it was 3.9% and, lastly, in Gipuzkoa it was 4.0%.

Finally, the index of people employed in large stores and food chains in the Basque Country during December 2021 was down 0.1% in relation to the previous month. Compared to the same month of the previous year, however, the index of employed people rose by 3.7%.

Year-on-year variations are calculated using the series corrected for calendar effects and the month-on-month variations are calculated using the deseasonalised series.

Included as persons employed considered in this and other short-term indices, are those covered by an ERTE (Temporary Labour Force Adjustment Plan), following the definition of persons employed indicated by the Statistical Office of the European Union (Eurostat) in its manual [Methodology of Short Term Business Statistics](#).

The models used in the correction of calendar effects and deseasonalisation of the series include the effect of COVID-19 on the variables studied, following the recommendations of the Statistical Office of the European Union (Eurostat) in its methodological note [Guidance on Time Series Treatment in the context of the COVID-19 crisis](#).

Eustat would like to thank all the establishments that have collaborated in preparing the Large Stores and Food Chains Trade Index. As a result, the index December 2021 was calculated with **100% coverage**.
